Course outline	Understanding the causes of fuel poverty, who is at risk, its impact on households and how to tackle problems.
Objectives	<p>One in four people struggle to heat their homes and this number is set to increase with rising fuel prices. Households that spend ten per cent or more of their disposable income on fuel are deemed to be living in fuel poverty.</p> <p>This course sets out to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide awareness of the main factors that cause fuel poverty • Understand the social impacts and health effects of living in a cold damp home • Provide a clear understanding of the issues that exacerbate fuel poverty and how to identify the priorities of those unable to heat their home affordably • Provide practical advice on what can be done to tackle fuel poverty • Provide information on where to get grant-aided home improvements
